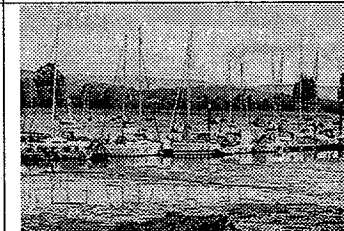
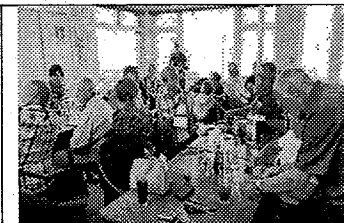
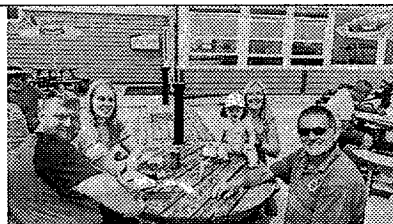

At Bembridge this year on the first day I noticed my Heads was leaking. So on the Saturday morning we set off on the buses to the Sailing Capital of Europe to buy new Heads. Well they had the bits but no complete Heads. What a letdown, I suppose everyone buys on the internet these days.

This was urgent as Margaret was coming to join us on the Wednesday. I dismantled my old RM69 Sea Toilet, after two attempts using spare bits from an old pump, I managed to stem the leak if flushing was not used and the seacock turned off.

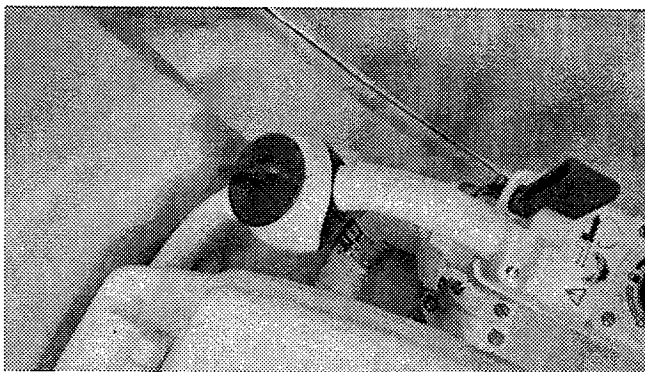
We managed until we got home and I ordered a Jabsco Replacement for the RM69 that I had on Hazy Daze.

In Ricks previous article on Heads and connecting pipes I was wondering if I would have the strength to fit the pipes. Well the outlet was easy enough though the pipe came out at a different angle. The inlet pipe however was very loose so I had to wrap gaffer tape around the fitting before fitting the inlet pipe.

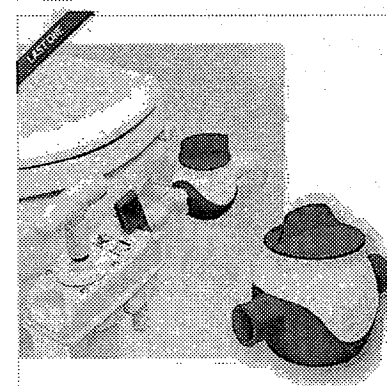
The footprint of the Jabsco Heads was different so not a single mounting hole lined up. So I had to fill the old holes and drill new ones.



Dave Bannister showed me the sanitiser he had fitted to Symphony so I ordered one on the internet. It was easy to fit just cut the flushing pipe and push it onto the unit.



It takes any commercial 45gm sanitiser tablet up to 35mm diameter.
